

Dear Parents,

In this activity your child practices identifying and spelling irregular verb forms. An irregular verb is one for which the past tense does not add the ed suffix, but forms a new word.

regular verb form: wait/waited

irregular verb form: speak/spoke

Write the irregular past tense verb forms.

This task provides practice identifying and spelling irregular verb forms. Most verbs form the past tense with the addition of ed. Those that don't are called irregular verbs, for example withhold withheld. Guide your child through the activity.
